

Privacy

CDT values your privacy and is committed to handling your personal information sensitively and securely.

What information does CDT collect?

We ask you to provide your name, address, telephone numbers, email address, date of birth, emergency contact details (name and phone number) and details of medical conditions. We record your attendance at classes and may record information you provide in communications with us.

How do we use your information?

Your information is used for internal administration and in the event of an emergency.

Privacy statement

Your privacy is respected and we store all information securely.

Your information will not be disclosed to a third party without your consent except in an emergency situation where you are unconscious or incapacitated.

We will send member newsletters to your email address each term. We may also occasionally email information relating to upcoming dance events. If you do not wish to receive member newsletters or other information by email, please let us know.

If you would like to know what personal information CDT holds about you or to update your details, please contact us either by talking to your class administrator, or phone or email.

Keeping our records up to date

Please let us know if any of your details (address, telephone, email or medical circumstances) change, so that we can update our records.



Student responsibilities

- Ensure your membership and contact details are up to date.
- Inform your teacher if you have any medical conditions that may affect your participation.
- Ensure you arrive with sufficient time to register for your class, and are ready to participate from the very beginning of that class. This is essential for warming up safely and responsibly.
- While in class please take responsibility for adjusting your personal dance practice to suit your own ability, in order to avoid personal injury.
- Endeavour to keep the studio, change rooms and toilet as clean and tidy as possible to make the surroundings pleasant, safe and hygienic for all users.

Canberra Dance Theatre

Canberra Dance Theatre (CDT) has been operating in the ACT and beyond since 1978, delivering a wide range of dance performances, classes, programs and special events. During these 30 years, CDT had worked locally, nationally and internationally, and is now based in a purpose built facility, in the rapidly expanding western cultural precinct of Canberra City.

CDT is a not-for-profit incorporated association, run by the Artistic Director and Company Manager, and a group of volunteers (the CDT Board). Everyone who comes to CDT for dance classes has to become a member of the association.

A major part of CDT business is to run dance classes. These are mainly for adults but some special classes are also run for younger people. CDT students and teachers perform at some ACT dance events including Floriade, the National Multicultural Festival and the Belconnen Festival. From time to time, CDT also offers professional development classes (e.g. in dance safety) and a range of specialist workshops on various Sundays during the year.

Dance classes take place during ACT school terms. At the end of most terms CDT holds a party for all members, families and friends to get together and enjoy food, dance, music and chat.

Members of CDT are elected to the Board at the annual general meeting held in April or May each year. Nomination forms (available just before the AGM) need to be endorsed by any CDT member.

The Board meets monthly to manage the business affairs of CDT. Board members also work as class administrators marking the roll and collecting money before each class.

The Board is always happy to receive your ideas – comments, compliments or complaints – so that CDT can continue to improve the services it offers and be the kind of dance organisation that serves its members best.



CDT membership

The CDT constitution requires all people who attend classes to join the organisation. Cost is \$20 and must be paid each year. On joining, members also fill in a membership form with contact and other details needed for insurance.

Membership benefits

- Access to a wide range of quality dance classes for adults
- Access to a large and fully air-conditioned dance studio, with sprung floor, mirrors and barres
- Comprehensive insurance covering injuries sustained during a CDT class, or while travelling to or from a class

- Free entry or discounted rates when attending any CDT studio performances
- Discounts to performances by QL2 Youth Dance Company and at selected retail outlets
- The right to vote at the Annual General Meeting
- Eligibility to become a Board Member of an active, energetic and committed community arts organisation
- A free Members Newsletter each term
- Opportunities to promote your dance activities and/or contribute any relevant dance information, articles, etc, to the newsletter
- Regular information about upcoming dance events in the ACT and region
- Develop links with other members of the ACT dance community

Insurance

CDT membership covers its members with accident insurance from DanceSurance Australia. Coverage includes:

- 80% of non-Medicare expenses up to \$2000 per injury
- physiotherapy (75 to 95% of costs)
- loss of income for full-time employees
- costs incurred by full-time students
- domestic home help for non-income earners
- death and disablement benefits.

If you sustain an injury in class, or travelling to or from class, please see your class administrator to fill out an accident form. Generally claims can only be made within 30 days of the injury.
